History of Oklahoma Turnpike Authority

 The State Legislature created the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority in 1947. (To become Free)

 In 1954, Oklahomans voted to change the business model of Oklahoma Turnpike Authority (Cross-Pledge).



History of Oklahoma Turnpike Authority

 Oklahoma Turnpike Authority does not receive any state or federal appropriations.

History of Oklahoma Turnpike Authority

- Includes 10 turnpikes (606 centerline miles) across the state of Oklahoma.
- Complement state needs that Oklahoma DOT is unable to fund.
- Close to 40% of revenue comes from out-ofstate motorists.




8 Years before the Gateway Arch, 1965





Turner Vertical Curves


