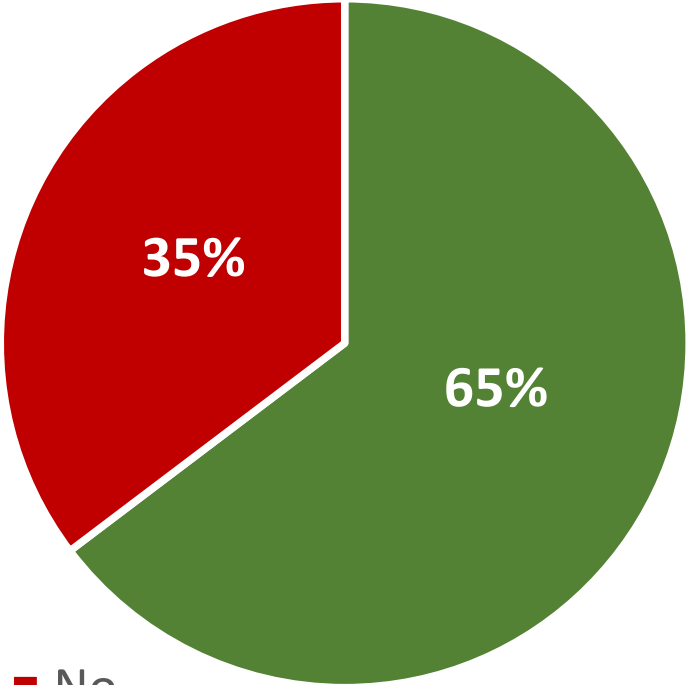

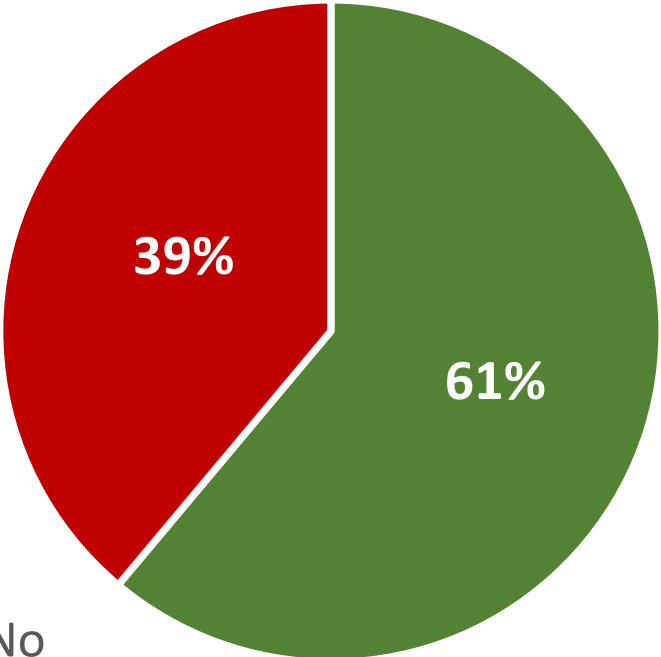
Do you have a policy statement on environmental, sustainability and resilience commitments?

Do you have a detailed plan to address climate action, sustainability and/or resiliency?

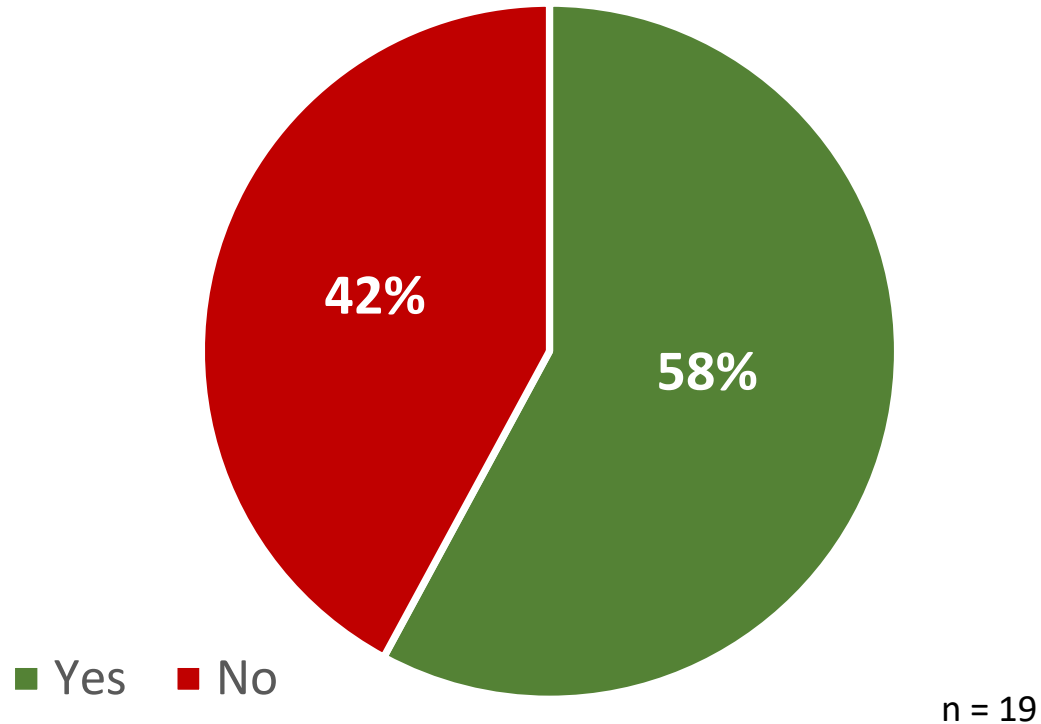

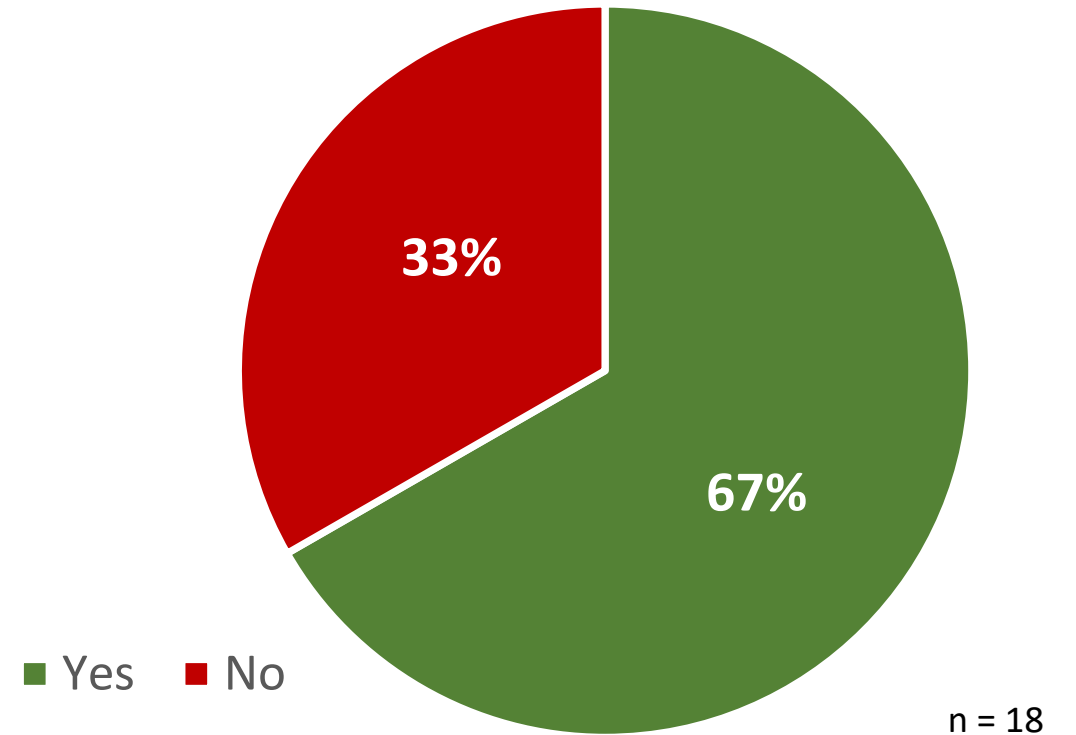

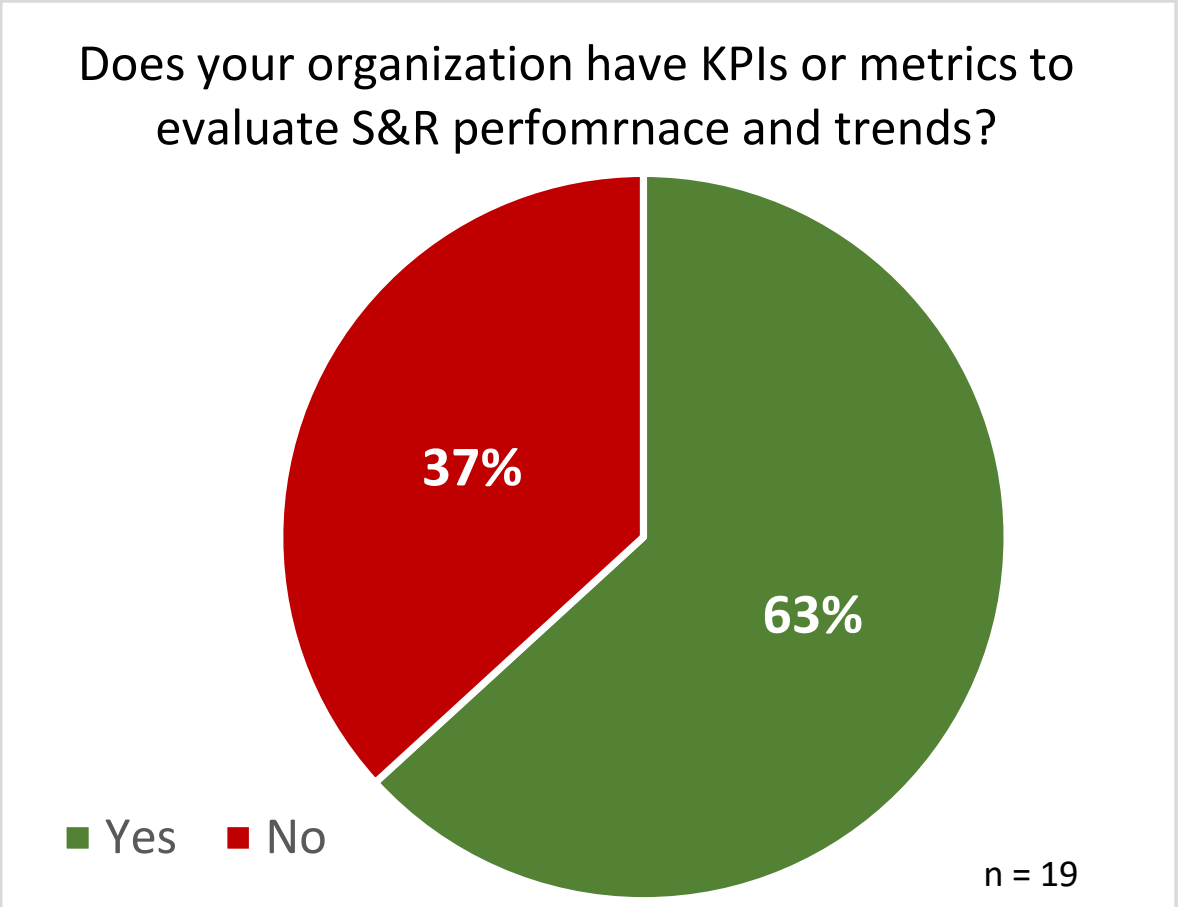
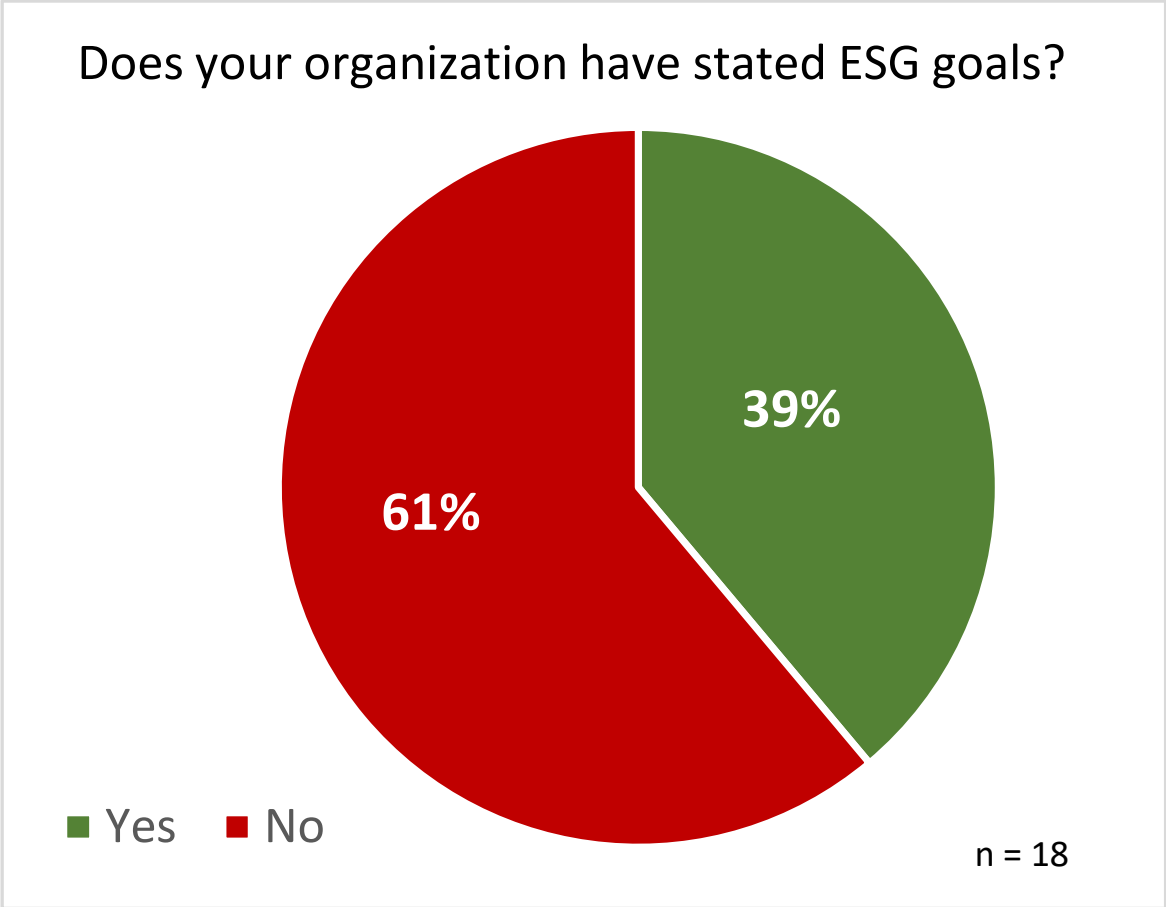
Does your organization understand and embrace ESG principles?

Availability of Goals and Performance Measures

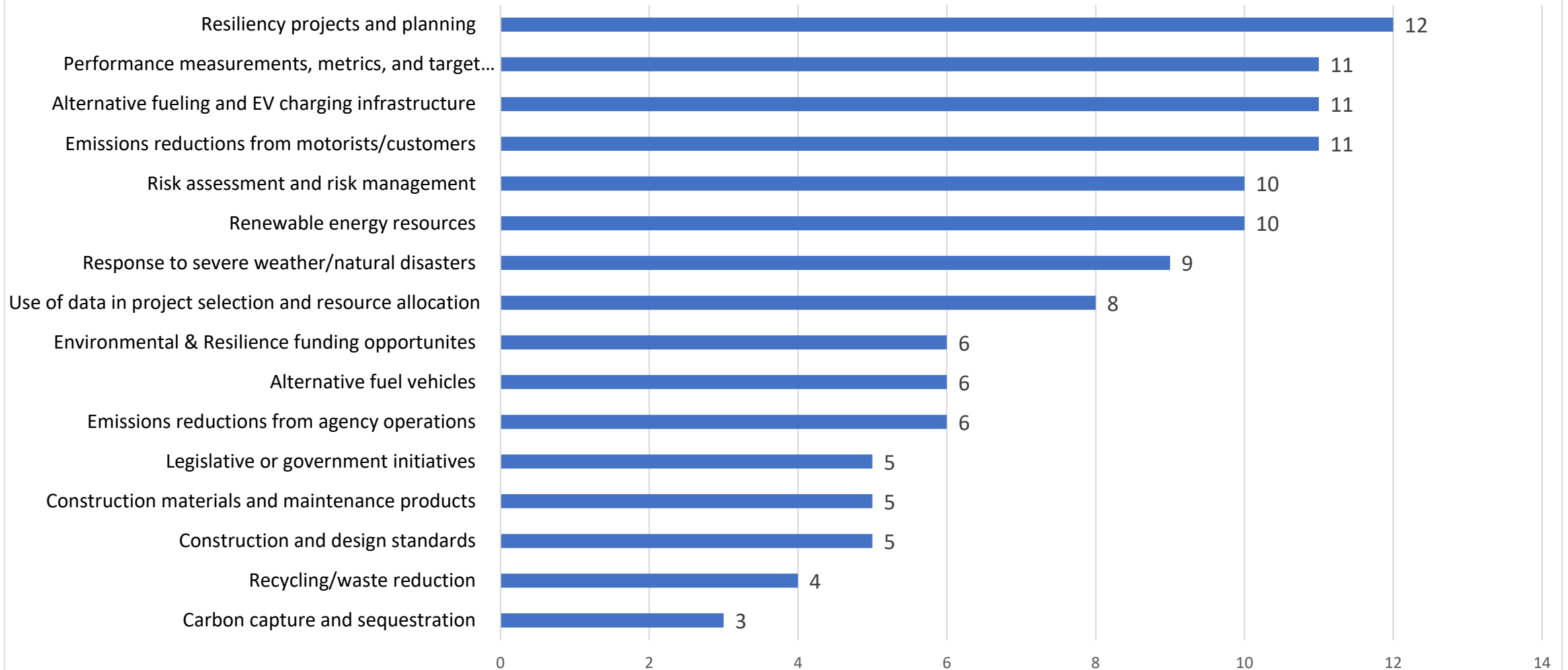

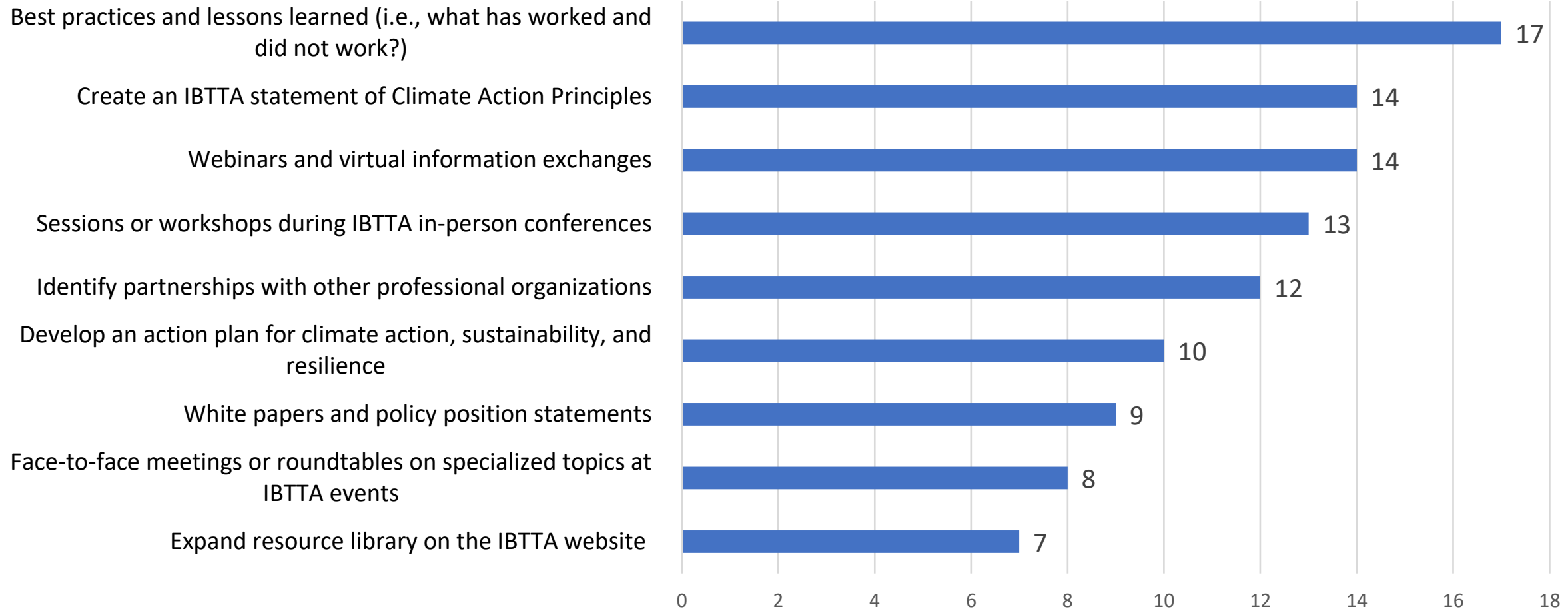
S&R Topics of Greatest Interest

Proposed IBTTA Climate Action Principles Document

IBTTA's Board of Directors has endorsed the development of a statement of principles on climate action. We seek to have IBTTA's principles address:

- High priorities that can be messaged simply.
- Focus on mobility, not just roads but also how toll facilities fit within a multimodal network.
- Address sustainability and resilience as separate topics for action.
- Consider a balanced view that addresses all aspects of ESG concepts.
- Identify actions for the Association to undertake to support its members.
- Produce a set of principles in 2023 that we share internationally in November.
