 - Committed to going to Multi Lane Free Flow in 2021
 - POC started in 2022

Vietnam Development



- Road network plan in a period of 2021 2030:
 - Use of ETC nationwide
 - Committed to Free Flow tolling
 - Transitioning from DSRC to 6C and ANPR
 - As of Jun 2022, ~ 65% vehicles (~3 Mil) are using e-tags
 - The MoT requires adoption to reach 80-90%
 - More expressways planned
 - By 2025: 2,542 km more
 - By 2030: 1,339 km more
 - By 2050 reaching > 9,000 km total length

India Development



- Road network plan in a period of 2021 2025
 - Mandated the use of ETC nationwide
 - Free Flow tolling pilot projects implemented
 - 94% ETC Penetration (Stop & Go)
 - 64 Million ETC users 11 Million Transactions / day
 - More expressways planned
 - By 2025: 20,000 km of greenfield highways
 - 8,000 km of Greenfield expressways
- Tolling Revenue Growth
 - \$6+ Billion; doubled between 2015 & 2022 at
 - \$18 Billion revenue targeted by 2025





Positive Signs for the Tolling Industry

- ✓ Strong economic outlook
- ✓ Large population with growing income -> more vehicles
- ✓ Supporting government initiatives
 - Smart mobility
 - Improving road safety
 - Reducing congestion
 - Improving air quality
 - Further developing infrastructure to support socio-economic development
