This gap is particularly pronounced in areas like automated vehicles, smart infrastructure, and tolling systems, where the demand for tech-savvy professionals is rapidly growing. Programs like the IBTTA Foundation's scholarships are a critical part of the solution, ensuring that equitable, skilled students are equipped to enter and lead in these emerging fields.
